## Requirements for IJJC:

### **Complete the Capacity Building Assessment Tool for Organizations (CBAT-O)** *(Assessment available starting October 1, 2026)*

IDHS has contracted with ICOY to assess, train, and work with the Department's youth services program providers to build trauma capacity. The Department's goal is to have 100% funded youth services providers achieving and maintaining a "Trauma-Informed" status. All IDHS funded sites are expected to participate in the CBAT-O trauma assessment, training opportunities, and suggested action plans, if determined necessary. Sites will not be penalized for their responses or the scores that result from the accuracy of the responses. However, **all staff working under an IDHS grant are expected and required to take the CBAT-O assessment**. The expectation is for all sites to experience growth in their delivery of trauma-informed services.

- *Service providers are encouraged to attend all CBAT-O webinars and events throughout the fiscal year. **Participation in the CBAT-O Learning Community is expected of all participants in the Spring of 2027.***
